Members can now write comments on the LINK website!

The LINK website now allows users to ‘post comments’ (leave messages) on particular pages. To be able to do this you have to ‘register’. Registration is easy – there is a link at the bottom of every page (click the word ‘Register’ which you can find at the very bottom of all LINK pages). All you need is a valid email address.

Write a ‘username’ in the first box. Rather than using your real name you may want to think of a different name for yourself. It may help to write it down so you don’t forget it! You will need your username to ‘log in’. Remember – you cannot change your username later.

We will then send you a password. When you first ‘log in’ with your username and the password that LINK will email to you, the system will go to a page called ‘Personal Profile’. Here you can change your password to something easier to remember. Just write the new password in the box at the bottom of the page and then again in the box underneath.

You can choose which name people will see when you post a comment (use the little arrow to the left of the box called ‘Display

name publicly as '). It could be your real name, your user name or a nickname. If you don't choose a nick name, the system will choose your username for you.

You can also add information about yourself IF YOU WANT TO. If you are not used to personal profiles or understand how they work *don't fill in anything else*. When you have finished making any changes remember to click 'Update Profile' at the very bottom of the page on the left to save everything.

Above every post are the sharing options (via Facebook, twitter etc) which are visible as logos. If you want to share the LINK page on these just click on a logo. Underneath these is the 'leave a reply' space. You have to 'log in' to leave a reply or to make a comment. Just click on 'log in to reply' or 'logged in'. Fill in your username and password and click log in. Now you can write comments in the box, just press 'Post comment' to send it to us. Remember you can't change your comment once you have pressed 'Post Comment'. Although the first couple of comments will need to be moderated (checked) by the site administrator (a member of LINK staff) users will be able to freely comment after their first couple of comments have been validated.

You can make comments on the events pages and the LINK news. Other pages such as archive material and the actual calendar page you cannot comment on. Each page which it is possible to comment has the 'leave a reply' space at the bottom. <http://www.essexandsouthendlink.org.uk/>

In October 2009 the Autism Bill was passed by parliament. Under the new law, the NHS and local authorities will have to provide diagnostic services for adults with autism (including

Asperger syndrome) and better training for health and social care staff. This week the Autism Strategy was published:

Your GP, your choice, your say

You can choose which hospital you go to, so why shouldn't you be able to choose your GP practice?

The NHS is carrying out a consultation on giving people more choice – so you can choose a GP practice that best suits your needs. The consultation is seeking views on the various options for enabling patients to register with the GP practice that best meets their needs, whether that is a practice near work, or simply a different practice near home that offers more services or longer opening hours. It also means that patients can stay registered at their current practice if they move house.

Essex County Council Personal Budgets Workshop

Since October 2008 Essex County Council (ECC) has given personal budgets to all new service users. The purpose of personal budgets is to give individuals more choice and control over their support arrangements, but not everyone wants to or is able to manage a cash payment. They are looking at ways to give more choice and control to people who choose to ask ECC to arrange services for them. One way of doing this may be to introduce a new management option called an 'Individual Service Fund' (ISF).

Essex County Council have now organised a one day workshop event to give information on personal budgets and help service users decide if they want a personal budget or a traditional service. The workshop is scheduled for 9th March and will be held in Chelmsford.

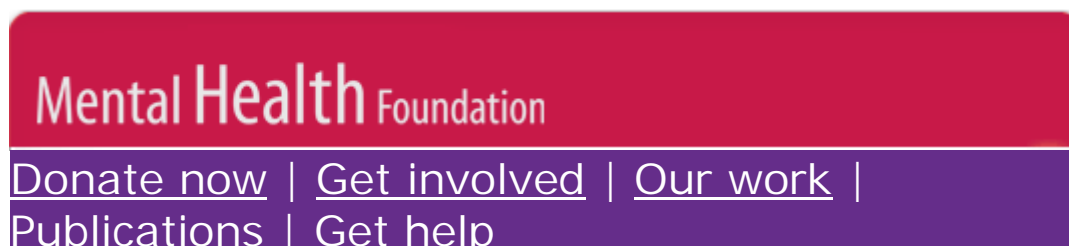
