VTE (Blood clots) Patient Information Leaflet – March 2010

The Eastern Development Centre is currently undertaking a high priority project in the East of England to reduce the number of blood clots in hospitals. It is estimated that up to 25,000 people a year die of blood clots in hospital in England yet there is a safe, efficient way to prevent these. As part of the project, they are developing a standard version of patient information leaflet on blood clots for the East of England.

Hearing Voices

Dr Ellie Sorrell, Clinical Psychologist at North Essex Partnership NHS Foundation Trust, has published her paper about hearing voices (known as auditory hallucinations). Dr Sorrell said: "Our main finding was that the qualities of the relationships that people form with their voices have a major bearing on how distressed by the experiences (or not) they are. The findings provide further evidence to support the assertion that it is not the voice hearing experience as such, that cause distress, but the interpretations that are placed upon it."
